Thought for the Day by Jennifer Holloway

Greetings for the Festival of Easter!

The familiar reading from John 20 v1-18 talks about Mark Magdalene finding the crucified Jesus' empty tomb, then running to tell the disciples, who confirmed this. They went home, not yet understanding that Jesus had risen. But

Mary stayed there, weeping. Looking back into the tomb, she saw two angels, and then, turning, she saw a figure she thought might be the gardener. When he spoke and called her name, she understood and believed what the scriptures had said, that Christ had risen!

A time-honoured reading, which as Christians today, we believe and it fills us with joy and wonderment. The words of the choir anthem on Easter morning (taken from John 11v 25-26) are "I am the resurrection and the life. He that believeth in me, yet shall he live, though he were dead. And whosoever liveth in me shall never die." That is the message of Easter for us today. The ultimate goal is there for us all, if we seek to follow a Christian journey.

Easter is a time of joy and optimism. But yes, we cannot forget the awful things around the world we hear of each day and feel we are helpless to influence positively. Just one situation is in the Holy land and it has been perhaps poignant that this years' service for the World Day of Prayer on March 1st was put together by Christian women in Palestine. Their overwhelming messages were "I beg you, bear one another in love" and "put peace into each other's hands and like a treasure hold it". We can certainly pray with this message – if the peoples of the world fulfilled this, what a wonderful outcome peace would fulfil. Another message for us this Easter perhaps?

With the start of British summer time coinciding with Easter this year, we do have plenty to enjoy and look forward to. The emergence day by day of new life in the natural world, seeing more sunshine and a time to spend just seeing the emerging of new life in trees and flowers.

A joyful time! Happy Easter!
