Thought for the Day by Jean Lindley

'A Palm Sunday message is one of promise, humility and peace'.

We know that in Zechariah 9:9, the arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem was told long before it happened, 'Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Behold your King is coming to you; Miteous and having salvation is he, vulnerable and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey'.

Palm Sunday is very special in the church as we contemplate and pray for what is to follow. We are transitioning from Lent into Holy Week, time we can spend preparing for the special day when Jesus rises from the dead to save us all from sin.

Today begins with our receiving of Palm Crosses after which we can be peaceful and mindful leading up to Maundy Thursday and the following days. We all have our burdens I am sure, but I can't imagine what Jesus was going through, leading up to his crucifixion. His burden was heavy!

The Palm Crosses have been prepared before the service today and are blessed before we receive them. I always keep mine for a year, until Ash Wednesday. I use it as a bookmark and for when I pray. I find holding my cross as I pray useful and helps me to focus on my prayers.

Let us pray on this Palm Sunday, that you will fill our hearts with the humility and faithfulness that you displayed. We praise you in our hearts as we carry our crosses daily. "Hosanna in the Highest".
